"And welcome **Beyonce** and her dog," they announced as Beyonce's music accompanied the lady in shimmery gold strutting down the runway.

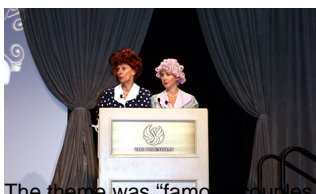
