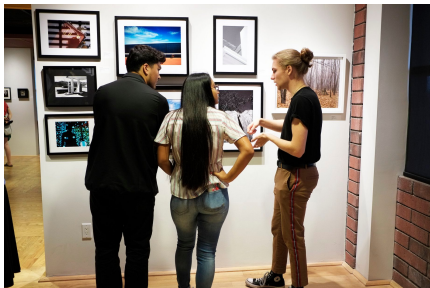
### Beats and Brunch at Jobot Coffee & Bar
