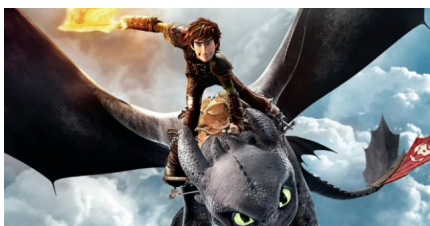
June

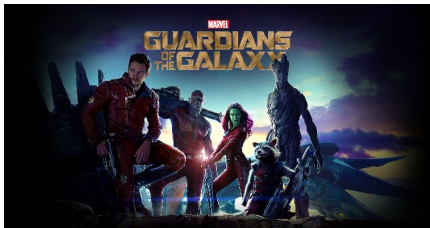
"Hercules" (NR) July 25
