The Crypt Haunted Attraction [MESA]

The Crypt is known as one of Arizona's longest-running haunted houses. With three attractions: the Crypt, the Asylum and Chaos, this adrenaline-infused event will inspire guests with new scares and heart-pounding thrills.
